At Jackson Purchase Medical Center, our goal is to deliver the best healthcare available in the greater western Kentucky area as we seek to make our community healthier. Over \$2.5 million in capital improvements

Last year, we invested more than \$2.5 million in our facility. Within the first few months of 2009, we will complete the expansion of our regional emergency department. We have also added new equipment including endoscopic ultrasound, 4D ultrasound, a Leica OH4 spine microscope, a Leica F19 ophthalmology microscope, Datex Ohmeda anesthesia machines and a Somnomedics wireless sleep lab system. We have made a number of quality improvements to our state-of-the-art facility including the renovation of the birthing center.

Contributing to our local tax base

Last year, Jackson Purchase Medical Center paid more than \$2 million in taxes that helped to support our city, county and state. This included sales taxes as well as property taxes. These dollars help to support local schools, development of roads, recruitment of business and industry, and other needed services.

Helping those in need

Jackson Purchase Medical Center provided over \$64.3 million in uncompensated care last year, which included the amounts not covered by government-sponsored programs such as Medicare and Medicaid. This amount includes \$4.7 million for charity care and bad debts, incurred as we cared for many people without sufficient resources.

Adding new physicians

During the past year, Jackson Purchase Medical Center has added several new physicians to our highly respected medical staff, including specialists in Family Practice, Gastroenterology, General Surgery, Internal Medicine, Nephrology, Neurology, Pediatrics and Cardiology. Our community and our hospital are very fortunate to have such a strong and diverse medical staff.

With an annual payroll of over \$20 million and more than 490 employees, Jackson Purchase Medical Center is one of the largest employers in the region.
